Hobson is a Licensed Ordained Minister and Pastor of Grace Baptist Church in Fords, and serves as Chaplain for the New Jersey Women in Law Enforcement and the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives. She and her husband Robert Johnson have four grown children and are proud grandparents.

For the past 25 years, Jeffrey Fields, Sr. has worked for Piscataway's Department of Public Works, while also serving as a part-time Public Safety Officer at Union County College. A dedicated volunteer at Arbor Hose Company, he has served for 14 years as Lieutenant, Captain and Chief. He coached Piscataway's Recreation Basketball for more than 20 years, and currently volunteers and serves on the board of the Plainfield Vikings America Youth Football League (AYF), where he is forming a youth mentoring program with his fellow coaches. Fields is also a Deacon-in-Training at Second Baptist Church in Matawan. His children graduated from Piscataway Schools and his grandchildren are currently enrolled in our school district.
