VIII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

PHS STUDENTS REESTABLISH MODEL UN WITH IMPRESSIVE RESULTS

The reestablished Model UN club at PHS is seeing impressive results in its first year back in competition. Junior Naomi Mandar received a Best Public Speaker award at the virtually held Rising Leaders Model UN Conference sponsored by the United Nations Association of Greater Boston, and attended by students from all over the world.

Naomi represented the nation of Mozambique in the Forced Displacement Due to Climate Change Committee. Juniors Yumna Qasim and Karishma Kesapragada, and Sophomore Vir Patel also participated, representing Canada, Bangladesh, and Indonesia respectively. UN Club members researched this issue for weeks. Students shared opening speeches and motions, and debated in breakout rooms.

This is a student-led effort. When Club President, sophomore Victoria Garon, sought to reestablish the Model UN club, she asked English teacher Dawne Dionisio to act as advisor. Mrs. Dionisio brought on English teacher Christopher Hamas as co-advisor.

Dionisio said, "This is a huge undertaking on the students' parts. It is like adding another class to their already full course loads."

The club held its own virtual Model UN Conference over spring break where awards were given to Yumna Qasim for Best Opening Speech; Junior Rayyan Makhdoom, Freshmen Sareena Naganad, Vir Patel and Naomi Mandar for Top Delegates; and freshmen Raahim Hashmi and Sophomore Meglena Mileva received Honorable Mentions.

The club meets every Thursday to study what is involved in attending a conference, the procedures during a conference, and many other topics regarding Model UN.

Congratulations to these students for taking such initiative to learn more about our world and how to navigate it through diplomacy and speaking skills.

FIELD DAY FUN

On June 4, across the district in our elementary and intermediate schools, we celebrated one of our favorite days of the year, Field Day. Students participated in friendly – and sometimes silly – competitions that focused on physical fitness and fun. Led by our PE teachers, our staff got into the Field Day spirit as much as our students. Activities included both in-person and remote students, with fitness stations offering a range of activities that included soccer skills, obstacle courses, dance party, relay races, parachutes, and so much more! Staff made sure students stayed hydrated, with some schools also offering ice pop stations or a visit from an ice cream truck. Randolphville capped off their Field Day with an annual tradition -- Dr. Slivko racing the third graders. Dr. Slivko wins again! A great day was had by all!

KNOLLWOOD CAREER DAY

Knollwood School held its annual Career Day recently. Students were encouraged to dress for a career they'd like to pursue and participated in career-related discussions and activities. Organized by counselor Dr. Sarah Aboudara, the day included informational videos and presentations produced by family and friends of the Knollwood community. These engaging videos highlighted careers such as firefighter, mail carrier, nurse, college professor, wildlife safari warden, and many more.

PHS STUDENTS WIN NJ VOCABULARY BOWL

After collectively learning more than 100,000 words over a seven-month period, PHS students were crowned New Jersey champions and as the seventeenth place high school in the nation in the 2021 Vocabulary Bowl. More than 43,500 schools throughout the United States and Canada participated in the annual event, whose goal is to motivate all learners to put in the effort, improve their literacy skills, and experience academic success. Every participating student sees results as they watch their contributions make their school's scores climb, while simultaneously improving their own abilities.

AAPI MONTH CELEBRATED AT QUIBBLETOWN

The Quibbletown School Community celebrated Asian American Pacific Islander Heritage (AAPI) Month with a week of art, food, and music activities. Celebrating the diversity of AAPI cultures, activities included making artwork inspired by AAPI musicians, and using Garage Band on iPads to remix Bollywood and K-pop songs. GRANDVIEW VIRTUAL FIELD TRIPS

The pandemic did not stop Grandview from having wonderful field trips this year. In May, Grandview Third Graders visited The Liberty Science Center where they participated in "Fundamental Physics" and learned concepts such as forces, motion, and pushes and pulls. Kindergarten, First and Second Graders went all the way to the Lone Star State where they visited the Texas State Aquarium. Students connected with an aquarium instructor via live HD cameras as divers reported live from under water. Second graders observed sharks while kindergarteners and first graders interacted with a scuba diver to learn fascinating facts about the coral reef habitat.

Matt Brickman, meteorologist for NBC, joined students in Mr. Tosies' and Mrs. St. Louis' fourth grade classes at ML King School for a special virtual lesson on weather. If speakers are uncertain of the legal ramifications of their comments, the Board urges them to seek guidance beforehand from their own legal advisor.

D. AUTHORIZATION FOR CAPITAL RESERVE DEPOSIT AND APPROPRIATION

Explanation:

The capital reserve account maintained in the general fund allows a district to accumulate funds for future capital projects. The Board of Education is authorized to transfer and appropriate funds into the capital reserve account through resolution.

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-14.1 permits a Board of Education to establish and/or deposit into a capital reserve account at year end; and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned statute authorizes procedures, under the authority of the Commissioner of Education, which permit a Board of Education to transfer unanticipated excess current revenue or unexpended appropriations into reserve accounts during the month of June by board resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Piscataway Township Board of Education wishes to transfer unanticipated excess current year revenue or unexpended appropriations from the general fund into a capital reserve account at year end; and

WHEREAS, the Piscataway Township Board of Education has determined that an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000 is available for such purpose of transfer;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Piscataway Township Board of Education that it hereby authorizes the district's School Business Administrator to make a transfer consistent with all applicable laws and regulations.

E. AUTHORIZATION FOR MAINTENANCE RESERVE DEPOSIT AND APPROPRIATION

Explanation:

The maintenance reserve account maintained in the general fund allows a district to accumulate funds to implement required maintenance of the school district's facilities. The Board of Education is authorized to transfer and appropriate funds into the maintenance reserve account through resolution.

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-14.2 permits a Board of Education to establish and/or deposit into a maintenance reserve account at year end; and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned statute authorizes procedures, under the authority of the Commissioner of Education, which permit a Board of Education to transfer unanticipated excess current revenue or unexpended appropriations into reserve accounts during the month of June by board resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Piscataway Township Board of Education wishes to transfer unanticipated excess current year revenue or unexpended appropriations from the general fund into a maintenance reserve account at year end; and

WHEREAS, the Piscataway Township Board of Education has determined that an amount not to exceed \$3,000,000 is available for such purpose of transfer;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Piscataway Township Board of Education that it hereby authorizes the district's School Business Administrator to make a transfer consistent with all applicable laws and regulations.

F. APPROVAL OF SECURITY PURCHASE BY NON-PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Explanation:

Local Boards of Education are required to approve non-public school security purchases made using non-public security funds that flow through the local public school district. The Educational Services Commission of New Jersey assists the Piscataway Township Board of Education in purchasing items requested by non-public schools within our jurisdiction.

1. BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education approves Rutgers Livingston DCC's request to the Educational Services Commission of New Jersey for 1 video intercom system to include 1 Iphone JOS 1-A, 1 Iphone 87180250C, miscellaneous items and labor in the amount of \$1,525.00 in accordance with public purchasing laws and regulations regarding educational adequacy.
2. BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education approves Timothy Christian School's request to the Educational Services Commission of New Jersey to remove, replace and install 5 door frames for a project cost of \$19,671.83 in accordance with public purchasing laws and regulations regarding educational adequacy.

G. APPROVAL OF SCHOOL FOOD AUTHORITY TO SCHOOL FOOD AUTHORITY AGREEMENT

Explanation:

The district runs a full-scale food services program through a contract with Sodexo Food Services. It is to the district's advantage to engage in School Food Authority agreements allowing other districts to have food services provided to them through our Sodexo contract. Both the business office and the food service contract monitoring consultant, Edvocate, have reviewed this agreement and believe it will generate revenue for the food service fund.

WHEREAS, the Piscataway School District and Academy for Urban Leadership Charter High School participate in the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) School Nutrition Programs that are administered by the New Jersey Department of Agriculture, Division of Food and Nutrition (State Agency); and

WHEREAS, Academy for Urban Leadership Charter High School desires to purchase meals for its school food service program from Piscataway School District; and

WHEREAS, Piscataway School District has adequate meal preparation facilities and is willing to provide school meals to Academy for Urban Leadership Charter High School;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education agrees to enter into a School Food Authority (SFA) to School Food Authority (SFA) agreement with the Academy for Urban Leadership Charter High School for the 2021-2022 school year for the purposes of supplying food services through the district's contract with Sodexo.

H. NEW JERSEY SCHOOLS INSURANCE GROUP MEMBERSHIP AND INSURANCE RENEWAL

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 18A:18B-1, et seq., enables boards of education to join with other boards of education in school board insurance trusts for the purpose of forming self-insurance pools;

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Schools Insurance Group ("NJSIG") is a joint insurance fund authorized by N.J.S.A. 18A:18B-1, et seq. to provide insurance coverage and risk management services for its members;

WHEREAS, the Piscataway Township Board of Education, herein after referred to as the "Educational Institution," has resolved to apply for and/or renew its membership with NJSIG;

WHEREAS, the Educational Institution certifies that it has not defaulted on a claim, and has not been cancelled for non-payment of insurance premium for a period of at least two (2) years prior to the date of its application to NJSIG;

WHEREAS, the Educational Institution desires to secure protection, services, and savings relating to insurance and self-insurance for itself and its departments and employees; and,

WHEREAS, the Educational Institution finds that the best and most efficient way of securing this protection and services is by cooperating with other boards of education in the State of New Jersey.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1) This agreement is made by and between NJSIG and the Educational Institution;
- 2) The Educational Institution joins with other boards of education in organizing and becoming members of NJSIG pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:18B-3(a), for a period of three years, beginning on July 1, 2021, and ending July 1, 2024 at 12:01 a.m.;
- 3) In consideration of membership in NJSIG, the Educational Institution agrees that for those types of coverage in which it participates, the Educational Institution shall jointly and severally assume and discharge the liabilities of each and every member of NJSIG to such agreement arising from their participation in NJSIG. By execution hereof the full faith and credit of the Educational Institution is pledged to the punctual payment of any sums which shall become due to NJSIG in accordance with the bylaws thereof, the plan of risk management, this Agreement and any applicable statute or regulation;
- 4) The Educational Institution and NJSIG agree that NJSIG shall hold all monies paid by the Educational Institution to NJSIG as fiduciaries for the benefit of NJSIG claimants all in accordance with applicable statutes and/or regulations;
- 5) NJSIG shall establish and maintain Trust Accounts in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:18B-1, et seq. and such other statutes and regulations as may be applicable;
- 6) By adoption and signing of this resolution, the Educational Institution is hereby joining NJSIG in accordance with the terms of this Indemnity and Trust Agreement and Resolution to Join / Renew Membership, effective the date indicated below, for the types of insurance as indicated in the Insurance Binder issued by NJSIG;
- 7) The Educational Institution hereby ratifies and affirms the bylaws and other organizational and operational documents of NJSIG, and as from time to time amended by NJSIG and/or the State of New Jersey, Department of Banking and Insurance, in accordance with the applicable statutes and regulations as if each and every one of said documents were re-executed contemporaneously herewith;
- 8) The Educational Institution agrees to be a participating member of NJSIG for the period herein provided for and to comply with all of the rules and regulations and obligations associated with said membership, including, but not limited to the NJSIG's Plan of Risk Management;
- 9) The Educational Institution under its obligations as a member of NJSIG agrees to allow for safety inspections of its properties, to pay contributions in a timely fashion and to comply with the bylaws and standards of participation of NJSIG including the plan of risk management;
- 10) If NJSIG, in the enforcement of any part of this Agreement, shall incur necessary expense or become obligated to pay attorney's fees and/or court costs, the Educational Institution agrees to reimburse NJSIG for all such reasonable expenses, fees and costs on demand;
- 11) The Business Administrator is hereby authorized in accordance with the Public School Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1, et seq., to execute such contracts and documentation with NJSIG as is necessary to effectuate this resolution; and,
- 12) The Business Administrator is directed to send a certified copy of this Indemnity and Trust Agreement and Resolution to Join / Renew Membership to NJSIG.
