Middle School Orchestra Students Learn Conducting

Middle School Orchestra Teacher Grace Lee incorporates conducting in her lessons for orchestra class. Students learn and practice basic conducting patterns in order to understand what the conductor wants to convey. When students expressed interest in conducting themselves, Ms. Lee welcomed them as conductors for spring concerts. She selected *Over the Rainbow* as a perfect piece for the students to work

with. They practiced their beat pattern with the metronome to help keep steady for a longer duration and learned to follow a conductor's score. Each student conductor practiced in class. Master Player Michael Goeller Takes On PHS Chess Club

The PHS Chess Club hosted Master-Player Michael Goeller for some hands-on coaching. Mr. Goeller challenged the chess club members to 12 simultaneous games. Challengers played singly, in pairs, or groups, planning each move during the time Mr. Goeller played his own moves at the other 11 boards. He played white on all boards, and started all games with the classic opening move of the queen's gambit: pawn to E4. The students appreciated Mr. Goeller's elegant play and encouraging words as he praised some brilliant moves and admitted they "gave him a tough time in many games." Podcasts from Schor School

Eighth grade students in Mr. Mercado's classes at Schor School select long range research/passion projects, gathering and verifying information from a variety of print, broadcast, and internet-based mediums. After completing their research, they use the information to develop four-segment podcast scripts that include a guest expert interview. Topics covered this year include the following: Investing; Climate Change; Getting Involved in Politics; Game Design; Learning to Code; and, Learning a New Language. Students can look forward to further developing podcast and broadcast skills at PHS by enrolling in classes in the TV and Radio Studios.

Career Day at Knollwood

When I grow up, I want to be... on Career Day, Knollwood's students came to school dressed for success. This family affair invited parents to highlight a day in their work life and included a neuroscientist who zoomed into the classrooms to discuss the functions of the brain, and in-person presentations from a state trooper, SWAT officer, train conductor, aircraft mechanic, software engineer, social worker, Navy veteran, teacher, and more. One family represented three generations, as a nurse grandmother and personal trainer mom presented to their first grader's class. WHEREAS, the Piscataway Township Board of Education has determined that an amount not to exceed \$3,000,000 is available for such purpose of transfer;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Piscataway Township Board of Education that it hereby authorizes the district's School Business Administrator to make a transfer consistent with all applicable laws and regulations.

G. AUTHORIZATION FOR CURRENT EXPENSE EMERGENCY RESERVE DEPOSIT AND APPROPRIATION

A current expense emergency reserve account may be maintained in the general fund to allow a district to accumulate funds to finance unanticipated general fund current expense costs. The Board of Education is authorized to transfer and appropriate funds into the current expense emergency account through resolution.

WHEREAS, the Piscataway Township Board of Education wishes to transfer unanticipated excess current year revenue or unexpended appropriations from the general fund into a maintenance reserve account at year end; and

WHEREAS, the Piscataway Township Board of Education has determined that an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000 is available for such purpose of transfer;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Piscataway Township Board of Education that it hereby authorizes the district's School Business Administrator to make a transfer consistent with all applicable laws and regulations.

H. AWARD OF FOOD SERVICE CONTRACT FOR 2022-2023

WHEREAS, the Piscataway Township Board of Education ("Board") utilized competitive contracting procurement procedures to procure food service management services in accordance with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.1 et seq.; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education approve and award a contract for School Food Service Management Services for the 2022-2023 school year, with options for the remaining one (1) one (1) year extension thereafter at the Board's discretion to Sodexo Management, Inc., 9801 Washingtonian Blvd., Gaithersburg, Maryland 20878, and it is the recommendation of the Business Administrator that the Piscataway Board of Education award the contract to Sodexo Management, Inc, subject to the following contractual provisions:

Sodexo Management, Inc. (Food Service Management Company hereinafter referred to as the "FSMC"), shall receive, a meal rate of \$1.9950 for reimbursable breakfast meals and \$3.8725 for lunch per reimbursable meal and meal equivalent to compensate the FSMC for the cost of operations, administrative and management costs. This meal rate shall be billed monthly less the value of commodities received.

Total meals are calculated by adding reimbursable meal pattern meals (breakfast, lunch and after school snack meals) served and meal equivalents. The number of School Breakfast Program, After School Snack Program, and National School Lunch program meals served to the children shall be determined by actual count. Cash receipts, other than from Sales of National Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program meals and After School Snack Program meals served to the children, shall be divided by \$3.66 to arrive at an equivalent meal count.

The FSMC guarantees that the Board shall receive an annual financial return of One Hundred Twenty-Six Thousand Three Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$126,350.00) including the commodity credits for the 2022-2023 school year. If the annual financial return for the Food Service program falls short of the aforementioned amount, the FSMC shall pay the difference to the Board. Financial terms of the Contract are based upon the assumptions as stated in Section II Standard Terms and Conditions, Paragraph 7 Guarantee Conditions and Assumptions in the Contract. In the event any of the following conditions or assumptions are not met during the 2022-2023 year, the FSMC's obligation shall be reduced by the amount of any documented increase in the District's total food service costs or reduction in gross receipts which is attributable to the charges in such conditions or assumptions.

Guarantee Conditions and Assumptions: FSMC's obligation to reimburse School Food Authority (hereinafter referred to as the "SFA") shall remain in effect only during the Current Year and is contingent upon the following conditions and assumptions remaining in effect for the current year:

- a. Reimbursement rates for food service program meals shall not be less than those stated in the RFP.

- d. The average daily student enrollment for the Current Year shall be at least the number stated in the RFP on Form #372.
- e. The ratio of students eligible to receive free and reduced-price meals as compared to total student enrollment shall not decrease from those provided in the SFA's RFP.
- f. The SFA shall continue to receive the additional seven cents (\$.07) per meal reimbursement for each lunch meal served authorized by the Healthy Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 and shall include such reimbursement in the calculation of Gross Receipts.
- g. Should the District require in writing that the FSMC take action which causes the cost of wages, salary, and/or fringe benefits for FSMC's food service employees to exceed the levels set forth in the attached Response and Projected Operating Statement (Form #23FP), the FSMC's obligation may be adjusted, by mutual consent of the SFA and FSMC, to cover the net increased labor costs resulting directly from such action.
