WHAT TO EXPECT DURING A WEATHER EMERGENCY

All Schools PreK – Grade 12:

When schools must close, have a delayed opening, or early dismissal due to weather emergencies, the District sends automated phone, email, and text messages to every family, and posts important updates on the District website, social media pages, and electronic signs in front of our schools.

Bus Transportation

During weather emergencies, bus transportation continues for all eligible students. During delayed openings, students should be at their bus stops two hours later than normal pick-up times. Refer to the chart above for emergency closure schedules at each school.

Before and After Care

When there is a delayed opening, Before Care begins at 8:30 a.m. for students enrolled in the program. For early dismissals, After Care is unaffected, operating at each school until 6 p.m.

Children's Corner Infant and Toddler Program

* During delayed openings, the Children's Corner Infant and Toddler Program begins at 8:30 a.m. On days of early dismissal, this program remains open until 6:00 p.m.

WHO SERVES ON THE BOARD OF EDUCATION?

Nine unsalaried, volunteer Piscataway citizens sit on the Board of Education for three-year terms. They are elected by registered voters during the November General Election.

HOW WE COMMUNICATE

Piscataway Schools uses the SchoolMessenger system that offers parents options for receiving District and school communications. Parents can choose to receive information via phone, email, and/or text message, and can install a handy app to keep all messaging in one place. The Genesis Parent Module contains important information for all PreK-12 students, including grades, report cards, and attendance. Make sure information is up to date in Genesis, as the District uses phone numbers and email addresses found here to contact parents and guardians, including during emergencies.

Register for Schoology

Schoology, a learning management system, allows parents of students in Grades 2-12 to stay up to date on classroom assignments, resources, and announcements. More information is available under the "Curriculum" tab on the District website.

HOW TO RESOLVE A PROBLEM

If your child has a problem at school, contact the following staff members to make sure the problem is resolved:

TECHNOLOGY

Technology plays an increasingly important role in our students' education. Piscataway Township Schools invests heavily in technology, and continues to expand and support hardware and software across the district.

- Piscataway Schools is a one-to-one district, with all students in Grades 2-12 provided with an iPad. Students in Grades PreK-1 have access to classroom devices. Each school provides instructions for iPad use.
- The District repairs student iPads and provides loaners when necessary. To request an iPad repair, access the IT Helpdesk page found on the District website under the "Parents" tab. Fill out a ticket that details the problem, and our IT team will respond quickly.
- Families who have difficulty with internet connections, please contact your building principal.
- Students in Grades PreK-1 use Seesaw as their technology platform.
- Students in Grades 2-12 use Schoology as their technology platform. Teachers post assignments and communicate to their entire class, as well as to individual students. Parents can create a Schoology account to access information and contact teachers by going to the "Curriculum" tab on the district website then clicking "Schoology Parent Resources."

STUDENT INFORMATION DIRECTORY

"Student Information Directory" means a publication by a district board of education that includes the following information relating to students: the student's name, address, telephone number, grade level, date and place of birth, dates of attendance, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities, weight and height relating to athletic team membership, degrees, awards, the most recent educational agency attended by the pupil and other similar information. This student information directory may be released to educational, occupational, and military recruitment programs. Parents who do not wish this directory information to be released must submit, within a 10-day period of receiving their school handbook, a written statement to the chief school administrator prohibiting the school district from including any or all types of information about the student in any student information directory. (N.J.S.A. 18A:36-19.1)

OFFICE OF PUPIL SERVICES

The Office of Pupil Services oversees educational support programs for students from PreK to age 21, including Special Education instructional programs and services, Child Study Team services, School Counseling services, nursing services, and home instruction. All of these programs contribute to learning success for students who may require additional assistance in school.

SPECIAL NEEDS SERVICES

Piscataway Township Schools' Special Education programs and services ensure students are educated in the least restrictive environment possible. Services include:

- Programming within the general education classroom with supplementary aid and services
- Resource programs provided in class or as pull-out programs
- Self-contained programs with opportunities for inclusion in academic and non-academic programs
- Home instruction or out-of-district programs, when warranted

CHILD STUDY TEAM SERVICES

A Child Study Team, comprising a learning disabilities teacher-consultant, a school psychologist or behaviorist, and a social worker, provides students, parents, and teachers with learning-related services for individual students. Child Study Team members also assist the Student/Teacher Assistance and Response (STAR) and Intervention and Referral Service (I&RS) Teams, identifying and supporting at-risk general education students who demonstrate early signs of academic or behavioral difficulty.

RELATED SERVICES

The Child Study Team/IEP Team may recommend related services such as speech and/or language therapy; counseling; occupational therapy; physical therapy; nursing services; transportation services, etc.

SPECIAL EDUCATION PARENT ADVISORY GROUP (SEPA)

The Special Education Parent Advisory Group (SEPA) of Piscataway develops a network of parents, educators, medical organizations, and other support services to provide the best possible care for our children.

CHILD FIND

Project CHILD FIND is a free referral service and public awareness campaign to assist in the identification of youth with a delay or disability. For more information, call 1-800-322-8174.

STUDENT WELLNESS AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

Piscataway Schools believes that wellness and mental health are critical to academic success, and that social emotional learning must be included in all students' overall education. Every school has a counseling office offering dedicated mental health assistance, supported by other professionals, including behaviorists, social workers, and nursing staff.

All schools offer wellness and mental health supports, social emotional skill development, and programs to build healthy habits and positive growth. At PHS, The Haven provides comprehensive mental health assistance for all our families while facilitating school engagement, academic success, and personal development.

PISCATAWAY HIGH SCHOOL

COMMITMENT TO EDUCATE

In January 2017, the Piscataway Township Board of Education unanimously adopted a resolution affirming the district's commitment to educate all children, "regardless of ethnicity, race or immigration status, and free from harassment or intimidation, for so long as they may reside in Piscataway."

A STUDENT CAN ATTEND PISCATAWAY PUBLIC SCHOOLS IF THEY:

- Are age 5 (by October 1, 2023) and under age 20, provided certain criteria are met
- Live with a parent or legal guardian who is a legitimate resident of the district

CHILDREN'S CORNER PRESCHOOL

Thanks to the NJ Department of Education Preschool Expansion Aid, Piscataway Township Schools can offer free, high-quality, full-time preschool to Piscataway families. This program is available for eligible 3- and 4-year-old students, and students identified with disabilities. Seats are limited. Applications are available in January for the following school year. Wait lists are opened after all openings are filled.

STUDENT SERVICES

TRANSPORTATION

Grades K-8 students who reside more than two (2) miles from their assigned school and Grades 9-12 students who reside more than two-anda-half (2.5) miles from their assigned school are provided transportation (in accordance with State law N.J.S.A. 18A: 39-1).

- If you reside UNDER these mileage guidelines, you are eligible for Subscription Busing, a fee-based district program that costs \$500 for the school year. Information for Subscription Busing can be found on the District website under the "District" tab, then "Transportation," then "Subscription Busing."
- Families apply and pay for Subscription Busing using Community Pass, found on the District homepage under "Quick Links."
- Students eligible for the School Nutrition Program are eligible for reduced fee Subscription Busing and should contact the Transportation office at 732-572-2289 ext. 2365. Information and applications for the School Nutrition Program are on the District website. Click on "District," "Food Services," and "School Nutrition Program."
- All students must adhere to Transportation Rules and Safety Guidelines, found on the District website under "District" then "Transportation."

FOOD SERVICES/NUTRITION

Sodexo Food Service provides nutritionally balanced breakfasts and lunches daily at each school. Menus are published on the district website under "Quick Links." Sodexo can be reached at 732-981-0700, ext. 2062.

- **MyMealTime Online,** a food service payment management system, allows students to purchase à la carte items, where available, without having to handle cash, and parents/guardians can monitor their child's account balance, purchases, and deposit history.
- Parents/guardians deposit funds into their child's account online by credit card, or send a check to their child's school cafeteria.
- Register for **MyMealTime Online** at the district website. Click on "District," "Food Services," and "**MyMealTime Online**" for directions.
- Parents of children with food allergies should download and fill out the **Allergy Letter** from the "Food Services" page on the district website, and submit it to the school nurse.

HELP YOUR CHILD PREPARE FOR SCHOOL

Children's Corner offers tuition-based programs for infants and toddlers at the Children's Corner by the River campus at 2300 Cooper Street and toddler only at the Pond campus at 499 New Market Road. CHILDCARE (FEE-BASED)

Piscataway Community Education offers Before and After Care Programs. For the latest information about programs offered for the 2023-2024 school year, go to the District website under the "Community Education" tab.

- **Before Care** operates in all schools from preschool to Grade 5 where there is sufficient enrollment. Children are supervised from 7 a.m. until school begins.
- **After Care** operates in all schools from preschool through Grade 8 from dismissal until 6 p.m.
- Parents must register for these programs every year. Convenient online registration is available on the district website. Look for "Community Pass" under Quick Links.

JUMP AHEAD ACADEMIC ASSISTANCE AND ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

Jump Ahead combines digital learning with direct instruction and is offered in summer and during the school year. Students who are not learning at grade level or need to maintain their skills may be invited to Jump Ahead for Academic Assistance in Language Arts and Math, free of charge. Jump Ahead Academic Enrichment is offered in Language Arts, Math, and SAT Prep.

SUMMER CAMP AND ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS

Full-Day Summer Camp is an all-inclusive program for children from Preschool through Grade 8, and offers morning and afternoon activities, including swimming, guest performers, and field trips. Camp begins when the school year ends.

AFTER-SCHOOL ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS


