Explanation:

For the past four years, Piscataway High School's Debate Team, under the advisement of teacher Craig Hoek, has participated in a regional ethics debate hosted by Stevens Institute in Hoboken, NJ. Winners of the debate at Stevens move on to the national competition hosted by The Parr Center at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. By winning the regional competition at Stevens Institute in December 2013, the Piscataway High School Debate Team has earned a place in the national finals. This year, the national competition will be held at the University of North Carolina on April 4 & 5, 2014. The Debate Team is asking the Board of Education to fund this which will be approximately \$4000 to cover the air transportation for 5 students and their coach as well as two nights stay for an additional chaperone. The Parr Center is providing two nights hotel arrangement for the students and one coach as well as ground transportation and some meals for students.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Township Board of Education authorizes five student members of the Piscataway High School Debate Team and Coach Craig Hoek and chaperone Nadyne Perlin to attend and participate in the High School Ethics Bowl National Finals to be held at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill, NC April 4-5, 2014. This trip will be at a cost of approximately \$4000 to the Board.
