B. STUDENT ATTENDANCE AT THE FUTURE BUSINESS LEADERS OF AMERICA (FBLA) NATIONAL LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE IN NASHVILLE, TENNESSEE JUNE 29 THROUGH JULY 2, 2014

Explanation:

Future Business Leaders of America is an organization for students interested in careers in business. Ten of our high school students won competitive events at the state competition in March and are now eligible to move on to the national level of competition. This year, the FBLA National Leadership Conference will be held in Nashville, Tennessee from June 29 through July 2, 2014. Club funds will be used to offset the students' fundraising of the remaining cost of this trip. This trip is at no cost to the Board.
