B. APPROVAL OF SCHOOL EXCHANGE VISIT FROM PISCATAWAY TO SPAIN (WORLD LANGUAGE DEPARTMENT) FEBRUARY 13-21, 2015

Explanation:

Permission is requested to plan, organize and carry out the proposed exchange visit from Piscataway High School to Sagrada Familia School in Barcelona, Spain to take place from February 13-21, 2015. The students in the Spanish classes of Piscataway High School will benefit from the experience of corresponding with and being hosted by their sister school in Spain. Amarfi Herrera (Spanish Teacher) and Glennysha Jurado-Moran (World Language Department Chair) will make all arrangements for this educational experience. Ms. Herrera and additional World Language Department staff will chaperone the school field trip at no cost to the Board of Education. A third chaperone will be determined later if the number of students warrants it. Students will be excused from five school days but will attend classes in their sister school in Spain; the remaining days are Presidents' Day holiday and weekends.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Piscataway Board of Education approves a trip for students from Piscataway High School and their chaperones to Barcelona, Spain which will take place February 13 through 21, 2015 at no cost to the Board.

C. APPROVAL OF INTERNATIONAL VISIT FROM PISCATAWAY TO CHINA (WORLD LANGUAGE DEPARTMENT) APRIL 1-12, 2015

Explanation:

It is requested that permission be granted to plan, organize and carry out the proposed exchange visit to Shang Nan High School, Shanghai, China from Piscataway High School to take place April 1, 2015 to April 12, 2015. The students in the Chinese classes of Piscataway High School will benefit from the experience of interacting with and being hosted by their partner school in China. The World Language Department chair will oversee the World Language high school teachers in making all arrangements for this educational experience, including chaperones for the field trip, at no cost to the Board of Education. Students will be excused from two school days; the rest of the trip occurs during spring break.
